WHO.....All members of volunteer, paid or part-paid departments of cities and industries who want the latest training in National Incident Management System and related skills. This training is recommended for all Emergency Response personnel, firefighters, hospital staff, law enforcement, public works/utility personnel, skilled support personnel and school, city and county officials who require a higher level of NIMS/ICS training.

WHY.....National Incident Management System training is one of the important elements that state, territorial, tribal and local entities must complete to become fully compliant with NIMS from FEMA and Homeland Security. Jurisdictions are required to meet the FY07 NIMS requirements as a condition of receiving federal preparedness funding assistance. ICS-300 and ICS-400 training will continue to be an essential NIMS training requirement in future years. During the conduct of this training, students move away from awareness training (IS-700, IS-800, ICS-100, and ICS-200) to practical application of ICS (i.e. establishing a command structure based on a scenario, development of an incident action plan, etc.). The next step in the training process will be for students to develop core competencies by completing ICS position specific training.

NIMS – ISC-400: Advanced ICS and Multi-agency Coordination

This course is intended to serve as a vehicle to share proven incident management strategies and practices as well as to enhance teamwork and coordination among all response agencies' officers directly responsible for emergency response to a WMD/terrorism incident or other "Incident of National Significance". The course is specifically intended for those emergency response personnel who have duties that require that they be directly involved in incident management or command at either a "field" Incident command post (ICP) or in a city, county, or regional emergency operations center (EOC). Topics covered in this course include: • Incident Command System review for Command and General Staff • Major and / or Complex Incidents/Event Management • Area Command • Multi-Agency Coordination
